




Let's talk about Facilities Management and the Budget (2020 Vision for Learning)

The district is currently working on the development of 2020 Vision for Learning - its new three-year plan which will include a high level review of the central and south zone, asset and facilities management and the three-year budget plan.

2020 Vision for Learning is a collaborative approach to developing a sustainable education plan for each of the district's zones of schools, and for district-wide delivery of services. The plan relies on the input received from students, their families, district staff and partners in the community. An online survey will also be available to provide input.




