Dogs on School Property

Areas of Focus for Our School

Successful Learner Traits

This year every classroom will be learning the Successful Learner Traits. In addition to classroom learning, we will integrate these traits into our morning announcements and Monday morning assemblies. The traits are creative, thoughtful, strategic, compassionate, industrious, confident, risk taking, and enthusiastic.

Social-Emotional Learning

Our school utilizes a Positive Behaviour approach to support our students' learning of expected behaviours. We focus instruction, practice and reinforcement on behaviours that are respectful, safe, and responsible.

Literacy

In our school district, balanced literacy is encouraged to develop skills in speaking and listening (oral language), reading and viewing, and writing and representing to make meaning of the world and prepare our students to be engaged, reflective lifelong learners.

Throughout the year, our staff will assess all students' learning regarding critical literacy skills. This will allow us to plan instructional activities that match our learners' needs. More information regarding learning resources will be shared by your child's teacher.

Numeracy

The BC math curriculum addresses the continued need for balance between conceptual and procedural understanding of foundational skills, including fluency with basic facts.

Our staff has identified critical skills each grade level we will strive to learn this year. We also developed assessment tools to monitor student progress and learning activities for intervention. We will continue to share information regarding your child's numeracy (math) learning and ways you can support at home.

The LPS Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)

Every parent of an LPS student is a member of the LPS PAC. The PAC Executive is comprised of parents, just like yourself, and meetings are held the first Monday of every month at 7:30. **MEETINGS ARE ON ZOOM OR TEAMSTHIS YEAR**

The PAC works closely with the staff and administration to enhance the educational experience of LPS students by organizing events and fundraisers such as: hot lunch, popcorn day, special craft days, book fairs, bake sales, the Winter craft fair, the Elemental Run, and many more.
